A LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR - Susan Jareckí

I utilize and so cherish my "me time". The time I set aside where I don't have to think about being a wife, mother, grandmother, sister, supervisor, or employee. Just me doing and being what I want at that moment. Early morning coffee on our deck, before the neighborhood starts to wake up. That is my favorite "me time".

Really think about it...What is your favorite "me time" activity? How do you make sure this happens each day or week?

I am bringing this topic up, as I know the volunteers we have add so much to their plates when working a case. You are not only taking care of yourself and your family, but you voluntarily decide to care for others that at one time were complete strangers. The work you do as an advocate does not go unnoticed. I have seen each of you pour your time, talent, and hearts into the lives of the children we serve, and I can't Thank You enough for it. However, we all get overwhelmed at some point.
